Evolving PBCs Through Effective Long Term Relationships

Performance Based Contracting (PBC) has emerged to be the contracting model of choice when supporting defence materiel within the Australian Defence Materiel Organisation (DMO)—currently over 30 PBCs with a combined annual value of \$1 billion which is expected to increase to \$1.5 billion in the coming years.

As we approach the tenth anniversary of the first edition of the *Aerospace Systems Division PBC Handbook* in September, it is an ideal time to pause and reflect on where we have come from, where we are and where we may be going in the future.

The aim of the forum is to bring together users, practitioners, policy makers and academics from both Defence and industry to discuss the future evolution of PBC in the next decade.

This conference includes a range of presentations that examine current and future PBC policy and practice via case studies as well as international and academic perspectives.

During the conference, participants will hear from:

- » The DMO executive on their assessment of the current and future state of PBC
- » Project Offices and System Program Offices on their lessons learnt
